Move Mountains: Mountains Can Seem Like Obstacles

5/12/24 Sermon by Pastor Nova Scripture: Genesis 12:1-9 (NIV)

Sometimes, movement can be uncomfortable. Faith requires that we face obstacles trusting in the plan of God.

3 Things of importance about: Obstacles, Abraham, Sarah

OBSTACLES - Bible Dictionary Greek - Empodia, Hebrew - negef or mikk-shohl, depending upon the use.

Greek- barrier, hurdle, impediment, hindrance, obstruction, Hebrew- sin, stumbling rock, barricade, hindrance, occasion for falling, past

Obstacles don't have to stop you. If you run into a mountain/wall, don't turn around and give up. Figure out how to climb it, go through it. or work around it. ~Michael Jordan

Obstacles are present in our lives; there's no getting around that fact. Sometimes, our sins, regrets, or past are obstacles. As Joyce Meyer says: We all have a past. No matter how bad your past is, you can get past your past. God can give you a new beginning; he can use you greatly and give you a future.


Obstacles, like mountains, should be climbed because they give us the privilege and opportunity to go to our Father for help, guidance, refuge, rescue, and understanding. If it does not kill us, it will make us stronger.

ABRAHAM

In Genesis 11:31, we see that "Terah took his son, Abram, his grandson Lot son of Haran, and his daughter-in-law Sarai, the wife of his son Abram, and together they set out from Ur of the Chaldeans/Mesopotamia (Iraq) to go to Canaan (Lebanon, Jordan, Syria & Israel-Palestine)." But when they came to Harran (Turkey), they settled there. Then, when Abram was 75 years old, God called him to go to Canaan.

Abram was already stable in Harran, with an extended family surrounding him, land, servants, and herds, but he must decide whether to abandon his land in favor of the land Yahweh offers. He must decide whether to abandon what family he still has in favor of the family Yahweh promises (against all logic, given Sarai's infertility).




Food Items Needed for May and June

He must decide whether to set aside his blessing and his inheritance for the inheritance Yahweh describes. The initiative offers much, but its cost is significant. Abram must trust and obey Yahweh, despite not being given a "game plan". God instructed Abram to step out in faith, literally. Blindly, Abram embarked on a journey that changed the world.

In Genesis 12, Abram (the exalted father) became Abraham (the father of many) when God made a covenant with him, promising him he would be the father of many

nations. When God gave His promise to Abraham, God also changed him into a new person with a promise and a purpose.

Sarah

Just like Abram, God changed Sarai's name to Sarah. Sarai (my lady, or my princess, which confines her dominion to one family) became Sarah (a lady or princess, simply and absolutely without restriction)

When God called Sarah to be the mother of many nations, what were her obstacles?

At 65, Sarah was unable to conceive. In that pre-scientific time, her condition was not considered a physical problem, rather it was viewed as a sign that God did not favor her. Sarah felt that she was an embarrassment to her husband, Abraham. Her culture viewed her as a failure in her primary function as a wife, to bear Abraham, a son. There must have been nights that, out of depression, she cried herself to sleep. "What is the matter with me?" she would have asked herself. "Why am I being punished like this?"

During those times, women had no choice but to adhere to cultural regulations. In some cases, beauty could be considered an obstacle because men of power considered their wives property or chattel. Sarah was also treated with contempt by her servant, Hagar, who she gave to Abraham to conceive a child, a son named Ishmael. Later, Sarah bore a son, Isaac. Even as a very young child, Sarah witnessed Ishmael and Hagar making fun of him, which saddened and infuriated her. As a mother, she could not

bear the sight of her son being ridiculed and belittled. She went to Abraham to discuss these matters.

When God called Abram, I believe God called Sarah, too. God was and is talking to all of His creations for His divine purpose. So, what was Sarah's reaction when God called her to be the mother of many nations? She laughed, but who laughed first? Abraham. Gen 17:17: Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed and said to himself, "Shall a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Shall Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?

We might think that Sarah's laugh was not important, but when her son was born, she named him Isaac, which means laughter.

"When a thing is funny," said George Bernard Shaw, "search it for a hidden truth." What was the truth behind Sarah's laugh? We can only guess, but here are some thoughts:

Maybe Sarah laughed because her situation was futile. It did not make sense. It was impossible. Maybe she laughed in fearful anticipation. Sarah's laugh was the nervous laughter of someone who wanted to believe in the impossible but felt foolish. She wanted to be a mother, a faithful woman who answered God's call despite all the risks and odds.

We are a people who want to believe. Even in Broadway musicals the lead character believes that "somewhere over the rainbow, bluebirds fly", that we can "dream the impossible dream", and "climb every mountain, ford every stream." The determining factor in life is not our situation but how we deal with that situation. Great people are often persons who have had to battle against overwhelming odds. People who climb mountains even if they seem like obstacles.

Most Christians, called by God, have two obstacles to overcome: Ability and Availability.

When St. Petersburg, Russia, one of the most splendid and harmonious cities in Europe, was being laid out early in the 18th century, many large boulders brought by glaciers from Finland had to be removed. One particularly large rock was in the path of the principal avenues that had been planned, and bids were solicited for its removal. The bids submitted were very high. A peasant presented himself and offered to get rid of the boulder for a much lower price than those submitted by other bidders. So, officials gave the job to the peasant. The next morning, he showed up with a crowd of other peasants carrying

shovels. They began digging a huge hole next to the rock. The rock was propped up with timbers to prevent it from rolling into the hole. When the hole was deep enough, the timber props were removed, and the rock dropped into the hole below the street level. It was then covered with dirt, and the excess dirt was carted away. (It's an example of what creative thinking can do to solve a problem. Source: The Best of Bits and Pieces, 1994, New Jersey: The Economics Press, p.41-42)

What a wise peasant. If we have an obstacle, it is an opportunity to pray and ask God for wisdom. For wisdom comes from the Lord. Every obstacle has a purpose. It will make us stronger, and God will be glorified. In the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit


