Where is Your Mission?

1/19/25 Sermon by Pastor Nova; Scripture: john 2:1-11

Today, we're diving into the story of Jesus' first miracle—turning water into wine at a wedding in Cana. But I want us to look at it through the lens of a question: Where is your mission field? Let's explore this together through three themes: Water, Teamwork, and Social Presence.

1. Water: The Essential Ingredient

Water is fundamental to life. When we went to India, everybody was telling me to drink water, "Doc" Darlene, "Pastor" Mark and Hollywood star, Doug, were my water police, because I sweat a lot and I would have a headache, that means I'm dehydrated. You cannot just drink water in India, it is a place where they don't have enough clean water, because water that comes from the well absorbs the dirt from the ground. When we arrived here in Mohnton, I checked the plants and saw that they were almost dead and crying out for hydration. But after giving it some water, the next morning, it stood tall, vibrant, and full of life. A little hydration made all the difference.

In our story, the water jars at the wedding were originally meant for purification—a serious, sacred purpose. But Jesus repurposed that water into wine, a symbol of celebration, love, joy, family, and relationships—a new way to bring life and connection to the gathering.

What resources in your life might God be calling you to repurpose?

- Maybe it's your time—something you usually dedicate to one activity could be redirected to serve someone in need.
- Perhaps it's a skill you've always thought was "just a hobby."
 Could it be used to bless your church or community?
- Or maybe it's even a space, like your home, that could be transformed into a place for ministry or fellowship.

How can you bring "water" to the withered areas in your mission field?

Imagine you're like a bottle of water. Who around you is spiritually dehydrated? Maybe it's a colleague, a family member, or even someone sitting near you in the church. It is your mission field. People who need encouragement, or are struggling with loneliness, and are going through a tough season. The resources you already have—time, talents, treasure, and even words—could be what God uses to bring renewal. Jesus transformed water into wine to bring joy to a celebration. He can transform our ordinary interactions into extraordinary opportunities to bring life to someone in need.










CHURCH STAFF OPENING: Janet Dearstyne will be retiring March 31, 2025.


We are looking to hire someone for the role of Administrative Assistant to begin on March 1st. This will allow a period of transition.



2. Teamwork: Working Together for a Miracle

Have you ever noticed how nothing big gets done without teamwork?

At the wedding, Jesus didn't perform the miracle alone. He gave instructions, and the servants obeyed. They worked together to fill the jars with water, even though it might have seemed pointless at the time. But because they followed His lead, they witnessed the miracle firsthand.

When we were in India, eight of us had a great time getting to know each other better. I noticed that we all had different gifts and experiences to offer. Yet we tried our best to support each other. For example, we were not singers, yet we all stood and supported Mr. Doug in singing praise songs. They were not pastors, yet when people needed prayers, they would step up and pray for people.

Our mission field isn't a solo act; it's a team effort.

Who are our teammates in life and ministry? Are we listening to Jesus' instructions together? Our family, church, or small group might be the team God has placed in our mission field. Like the servants, our obedience—no matter how small—can create space for miracles.

3. Social Presence: Being Fully Present

Let's talk about something we all struggle with...being present. Imagine you're at dinner with friends, but instead of enjoying the moment, half the table is scrolling on their phones. Or maybe you're thinking about yesterday's problems or tomorrow's to-do list while someone's sharing their heart.

Jesus was fully present at that wedding in Cana. He noticed the need and acted on it. That's what being present in your mission field looks like. Being present where God put you. *Communicate with people around you, see the need, see all the people.*

Our mission field is where God has placed us right now.

Whether it's our workplace, neighborhood, or church, God calls us to "see all the people." This idea, rooted in United Methodist traditions, challenges us to reach beyond our comfort zones and truly engage with those around us. Who needs our attention today? Who needs our smile, our listening ear, or our willingness to step into their life and offer hope?

So, friends, where is your mission field?

- It's in the parched souls that need refreshment.
- It's in the team God has placed around you.
- It's in being present where you are right now.

As we go into this week, let's commit to seeing our mission field with fresh eyes. Like the servants at Cana, let's follow Jesus' lead, work together, and be fully present. And who knows? Maybe God will use us to bring joy, transformation, and celebration to someone's life, and we can meet or exceed our goal of 206 (attendance on Sunday mornings) by 2026.

This is our challenge... again I ask, "Where is your mission field?" In the name of the Father the Son and the Holy Spirit, Amen.
