What Is Your Legacy

1/26/25 Sermon by Pastor Nova; Scripture: Luke 4:14-21

Today, we will reflect and study the life and habits of Jesus Christ, as captured in Luke 4:14-21. This passage reveals a defining moment in Jesus' ministry, but it also points to something deeper—His daily customs, His intentional habits, and the legacy He left for us to follow. As we explore this, we will also honor the life and faith of a beloved member of our church, John Rowe, whose legacy continues to inspire us all.

THREE WORDS TO REMEMBER: CUSTOM, PURPOSE & LEGACY

1. Custom

V16 - 17 He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read.

Let's take a moment and let that word sink in - as was his <u>custom</u>. The Greek word translated as "custom" here is $\epsilon i\omega\theta \delta \zeta$ (eiōthos), which is derived from the verb $\epsilon \delta \omega$ (ethō), meaning "to be accustomed" or "to be in the habit of." This word emphasizes that Jesus regularly and habitually attended the synagogue, highlighting His consistent practice of engaging in worship and scripture study.

Even as the Son of God, He did not neglect gathering with God's people. This was His rhythm of life, rooted in obedience and devotion to God. If Jesus, who is perfect and lacked nothing, made it a priority to gather with others to worship and study Scripture, how much more should we? His custom teaches us that faithfulness to the community of God is not optional; it's foundational.

Yesterday, our family gathered and celebrated our Christmas party. We cooked foods and prayed and ate together. Just enjoying God's goodness and the fellowship of each other. It is also our custom to have a *monito Monita*, or secret Santa. After eating we sing, *I love my Monita*, yes, *I do....*

Even though it is almost February, we make it appoint to gather and celebrate together. because it is our custom. A year is not complete without it.



2. Purpose

In Luke 4:21, the phrase "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing" includes the Greek word for "fulfilled," which is: πεπλήρωται (peplērōtai).

Breakdown of the word: Root verb: πληρόω (*plēroō*), meaning "to fill," "to make full," or "to fulfill."

This indicates that the action of fulfillment is complete and has ongoing results.

When Jesus the Son of God was born and dwelt among us, He was on a mission, His life was purpose driven and had a clear purpose: to bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives, give sight to the blind, and set the oppressed free. He fulfilled these words not just in grand acts, but in daily faithfulness. A Christian's life is one of following Jesus. When we examine His life, we see consistency and commitment to His mission. Our faith is not just about what we believe; it's about how we live our purpose daily.

Are we leaving a legacy of faith, and purpose like Jesus did? Are we showing up, serving, and proclaiming the good news in our own mission field. Remember last week our message is where is your mission field, now I ask, are we fulfilling our purpose in our mission field? Following Jesus means living up to the divine purpose God created us to be.

3. Legacy

Today, we honor the memory of John Rowe, a longtime member of our church whose life mirrored the faithfulness of Jesus. John wasn't just someone who attended church; he was someone who embodied the heart of the church.

As a Sunday School Superintendent, he poured himself into teaching and shaping the faith of others, especially the younger generation. Who here became Mr. Rowe's student?

But what stands out most is John's story of resilience and faith. John lived with a sense of purpose, serving God as a teacher with all his heart. John's life reminds us that our legacy is not about how long we live but about how we live. His customary habit of serving, teaching, and loving others was his way of following Jesus. And though he is no longer with us, his impact lives on in this church and in the lives he touched.

What Is Your Legacy?

So, let me ask you this again: What is your legacy? What habits are you building today that will impact tomorrow? When people look at your life, will they see someone who followed Jesus with all their heart?

Building a legacy doesn't require extraordinary talent or fame. It requires faithfulness. It means showing up, like Jesus did, to worship and serve. It means being intentional about your influence, like John Rowe was. It means living a life that points others to Christ.

Friends, what will your legacy be? Let's make it one that honors God and blesses others. In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Community Connections serves young adults in our area who live with serious health challenges. In order to support other families and children who experience similar serious disability challenges and expensive medical bills, a drive to collect a world record number of soda tabs has started.

From now until. Tuesday, May 20th, Calvary members and friends are asked to collect soda tabs, bring them to church, and place them in the bottle on the back counter in the narthex.

The soda tabs will be given to the Ronald McDonald House in Central PA to support families with housing and meals while a child is receiving medical care at Hershey Medical Center.

Currently, Canada holds the world record for number of tabs collected ~ 6.2 million, with a total weight of over 5,000lbs! It takes 1,200 tabs to equal one pound.

Let's help support this worthwhile community endeavor!




