FRESH START: Are You Sure You're Ready for This?

2/2/25 Sermon by Pastor Nova; Scripture: Mark 8:27-38

A Fresh Start Story

An angry reader, named Joey, once stormed into a newspaper office, waving the current edition and demanding to see the writer of the obituary column. He had seen his own name in the obituaries! Furious, he shouted, "I am very much alive! I demand an immediate retraction!" The reporter calmly replied, "I never retract a story. But here's what I'll do—I'll put you in the birth column and give you a fresh start!"

What Do We Mean by "Fresh Start"?

A fresh start means "a complete change in your way of life, especially after failure or hardship." It is like having a clean slate—where past failures no longer define us.

As we dive deep into the Gospel of Mark, let us answer 3 of the Most Important Questions of our lifetime:

- 1) Who is Jesus to you?
- 2) What is a true disciple?
- 3) Are You Sure You're Up for This?

Who is Jesus to you?

The context here was right after Jesus raised a dead girl, healed a bleeding woman, fed the 5,000, He asked His disciples, "Who do people say I am? and they said: John the Baptist, Elijah, or one of the prophets. "But what about you, Who do you say I am?"


Peter answered, "You are the Messiah."

One of the most important questions in our life is: Who is Jesus to you?

Peter, like many others, believed the Messiah would be a victorious king. But in Mark 8, Jesus flips the understanding of who the Messiah is, he spoke of suffering, rejection, death, and resurrection instead of gaining riches or power over another or even being great. Jesus said if you want to be great, you must be a servant first.

No one would have expected a Messiah to be rejected and killed by the religious leaders, let alone rise from the dead; nor would anyone have expected that the people's salvation would come this way. Why? Because God's way of offering a fresh start was through the cross—Through love, mercy, and grace. Not through human strength, power, or comfort. This new kind of "suffering servant" Messiah was offering a very big picture of "fresh start." It was a fresh start God's way, not the human way, which made it difficult for Peter to understand (v. 32-33).







COLLECTING SODA TABS IN SUPPORT OF COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS, BERKS, INC.

Community Connections serves young adults in our area who live with serious health challenges. In order to support other families and children who experience similar serious disability challenges and expensive medical bills, a drive to collect a world record number of soda tabs has started.

From now until. Tuesday, May 20th, Calvary members and friends are asked to collect soda tabs, bring them to church, and place them in the bottle on the back counter in the narthex.

The soda tabs will be given to the Ronald McDonald House in Central PA to support families with housing and meals while a child is receiving medical care at Hershey Medical Center.

Currently, Canada holds the world record for number of tabs collected ~ 6.2 million, with a total weight of over 5,000lbs! It takes 1,200 tabs to equal one pound.

What is a true disciple?

The Greek word for disciple is μαθητής (mathētēs). mah-thay-TAYS

- •It comes from the root (manthano), which means "to learn" or "to study."
- •Mathētēs refers to a learner, student, or follower—someone who follows and adheres to the teachings of a master or teacher.

Jesus tells us in the gospel of Mark: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?"

A true Christian disciple of Jesus Christ must first die to self to be alive; the way of the cross is upside down. We should be dead outside (our own self) and Jesus lives inside us.

How alive are we as a disciple? And how dead are we as a person.

Galatians 2:20- Apostle Paul said: "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

We believe that when we were baptized in water, we become Christians.

But are we Christ's disciple? To be Christ's disciple is not just about believing in Him—it's about following Him, no matter the cost.

Are You Sure You're Up for This?

Jesus' teachings present us with a clear and serious decision to make: *Are You Sure You're Up for This?*

Let's pause for a moment and let these words sink in:

- Who do you say Jesus is?
- Are you willing to deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Him?

Following Jesus is one step at a time, it does not happen overnight. Following Jesus is not only being His student but also His Soldier, we are always in the battlefield. Soldiers in the field of battle risk personal danger and death to help a fellow soldier. They are so focused on getting their buddy to safety that they disregard personal danger to themselves.

So, these words of Jesus might be rephrased in this manner:

'If any would be my disciple, let them become so wrapped up in doing the will of God, so taken up with concern for others, they forget about themselves.

'For the ones who live only for themselves will miss life altogether, and those who lose their lives in their concern for others, in doing God's will, will find fulfillment and satisfaction in life, which is eternal life.

Being God's soldiers does not mean that we will aways win. There will be days that we will fail, we will lose, and life will not be easy or good. But whatever our situation is does not change who God is and what Jesus did on the cross.

Jesus is offering us a fresh start today. But a fresh start requires courage, commitment, and daily surrender.

To follow Jesus means: choosing faith over fear, choosing obedience over comfort, and choosing sacrifice over selfishness. Jesus is inviting us to have a fresh start today. Are you ready to accept His invitation?

Taking up our cross is not just about suffering; it's about finding real life in Christ. It will cost us. But it will be worth it.

In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen.
