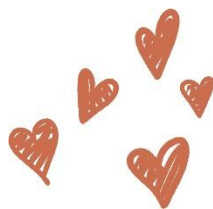

When we had our Auntie Anne's business in the Berkshire Mall, one of our neighbors was Mrs. Fields Cookies. They had what I consider to be the best corporate motto ever created, "Good enough never is". How many times in our lives do we finish a job "just good enough" rather than striving for perfection? Joann and I had a friend who was not doing well physically, and we would occasionally talk with her on the phone. Several times we put off personal visits, sacrifices of our time we rationalized, but then our friend died. Were the phone conversations just "good enough" or could we have significantly improved her quality of life, even if only for a short while, by sacrificing our time and effort?

Why are we Christians? Isn't it because we believe and trust the teachings of One who long ago refused to say "good enough" but rather lived sinlessly and set an example of perfection for us to pursue? We are reminded of His perfect sacrifice each Sunday as the offering plate is passed. The crimson pad in the bottom of the plate is not there to cushion the sound of our coins but rather to be a symbol of Christ's sacrifice, His blood shed for us to forgive our sins, the ultimate sacrificial gift.

As we struggle on our Christian journey, sometimes falling short, and sometimes exceeding our own expectations, remember the words of Paul from Philippians 3:12, a scripture summarized so eloquently by Mrs. Fields, and then we can continue our quest with renewed strength.
