Stewardship Reflections on Reflection

How often do we gaze into a night sky to admire a bright, full moon? Often it seems ablaze with a bright yellow or sometimes orange glow, and we think, "What a beautiful sight the moon is." Actually, the moon is craggy and dusty, inhospitable, gnarly and cratered. The beauty of the moon as seen from far away is just a reflection of the sun's light as the moon has no light of its own. We don't see the imperfections unless we use a powerful telescope.

God sees us as we see the moon, a beautiful creation reflecting the Son's light as we choose to follow the path He has laid out for us. He can easily see our imperfections but chooses to ignore them if we confess our sins and ask for forgiveness. Just as the moon goes through different phases exhibiting more or less light so do we. Our struggles and trials in this earthly life cause us to wax and wane in our faith but Jesus, our light source, is always there and He shines through us if we choose to be His prism.

How does this analogy relate to stewardship you may ask? I guess it really doesn't, sometimes I just ramble. As an update to reflect on the progress of our capital campaign, we now have received \$61,000 toward our goal of \$100,000. We originally used Thanksgiving as an end date. Could we move the campaign goal date up to Halloween? Let's use the month of October to reach our goal and to revive our facilities and our spiritual lives to reflect the full moon beauty of which we are capable.
